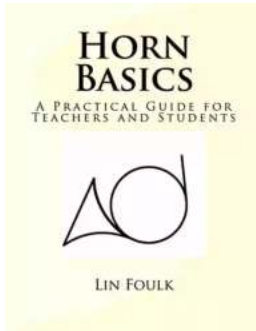

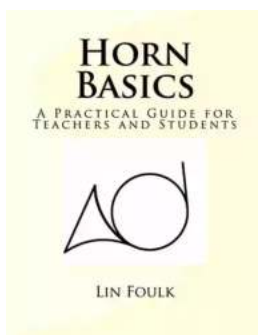

websites. If you are a horn student or music educator, you will want this resource on your bookshelf.



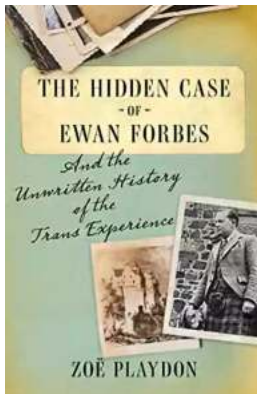
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
