These include food and water scarcity, mineral exploration and exploitation of the oceans. 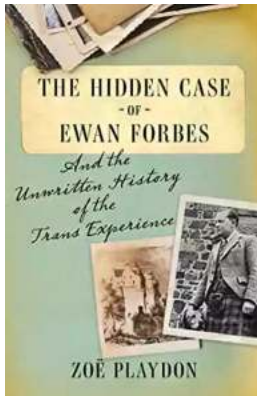

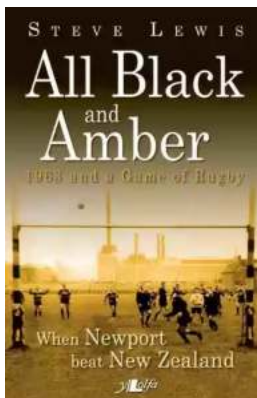
