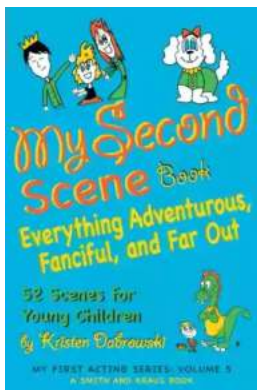


# Everything Adventurous, Fanciful, and Far Out: 52 Scenes for Young Children

## **9. An Arctic Expedition**

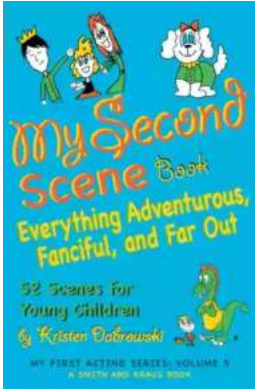

## Children (My First Acting; Smith and Kraus, Young Actors Series for Grades K - 3 Book 5)

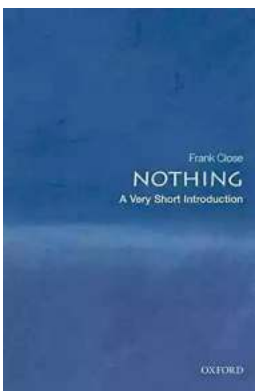
