

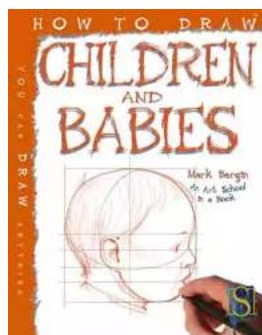

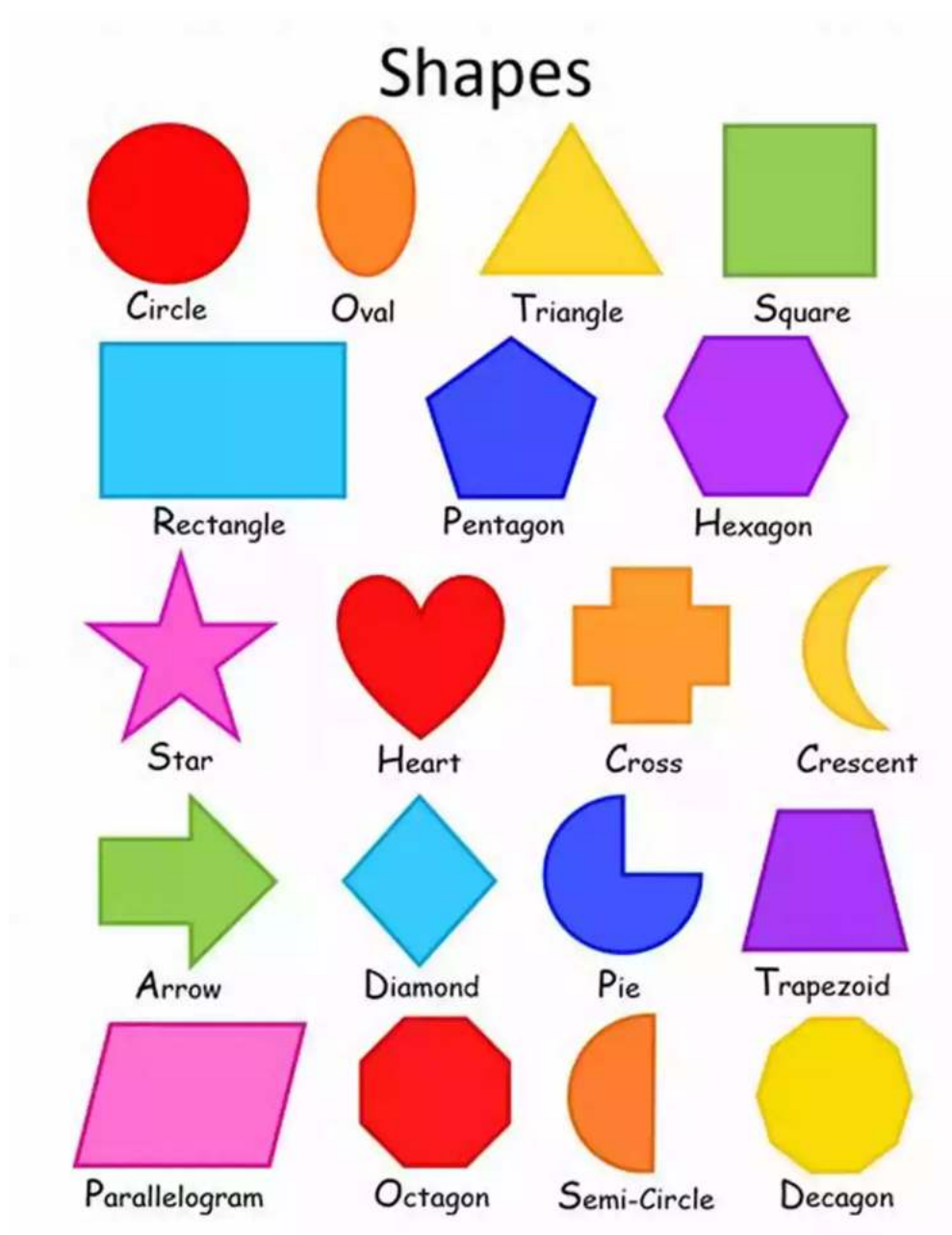

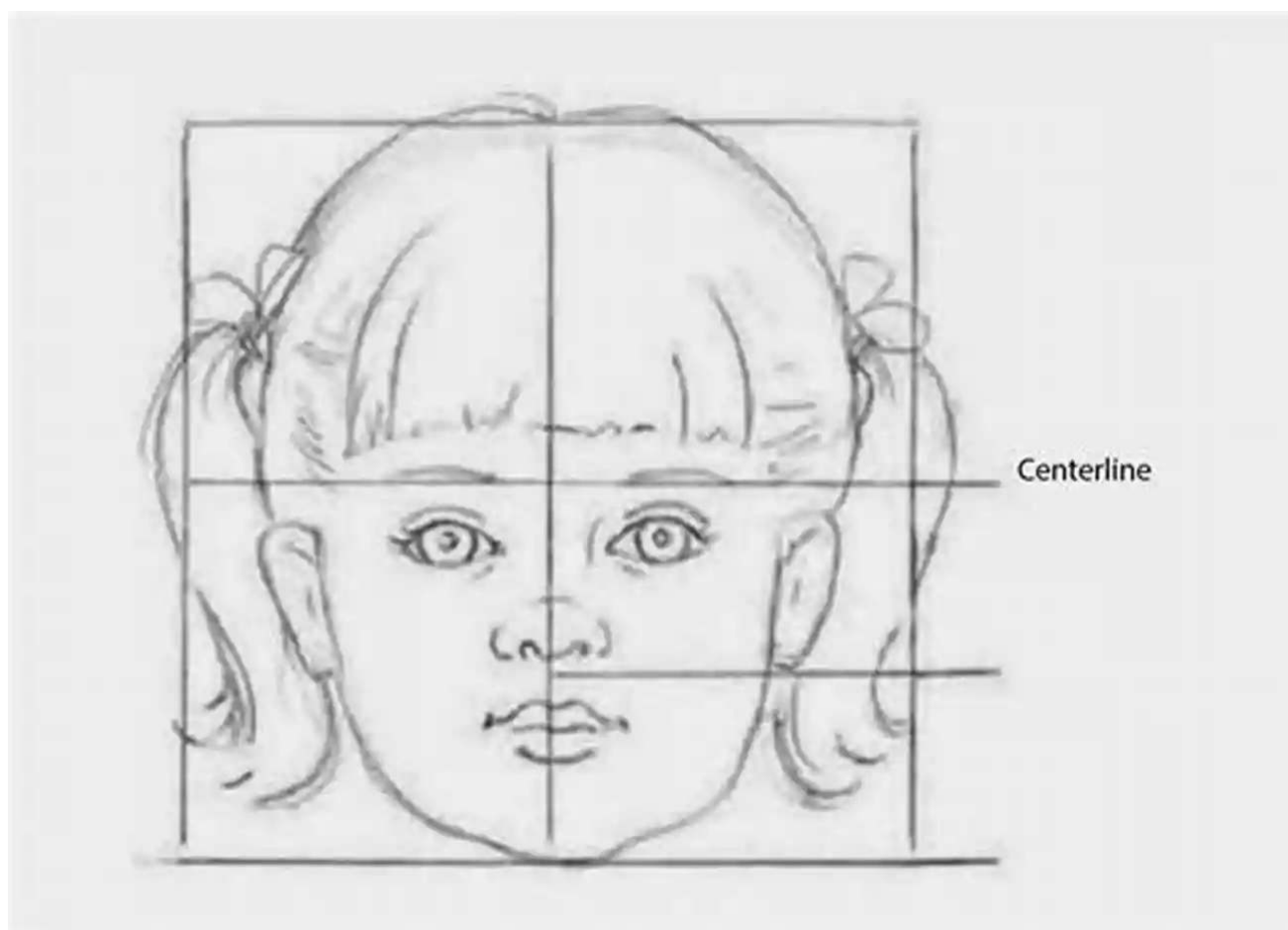


Drawing basic shapes for children and babies

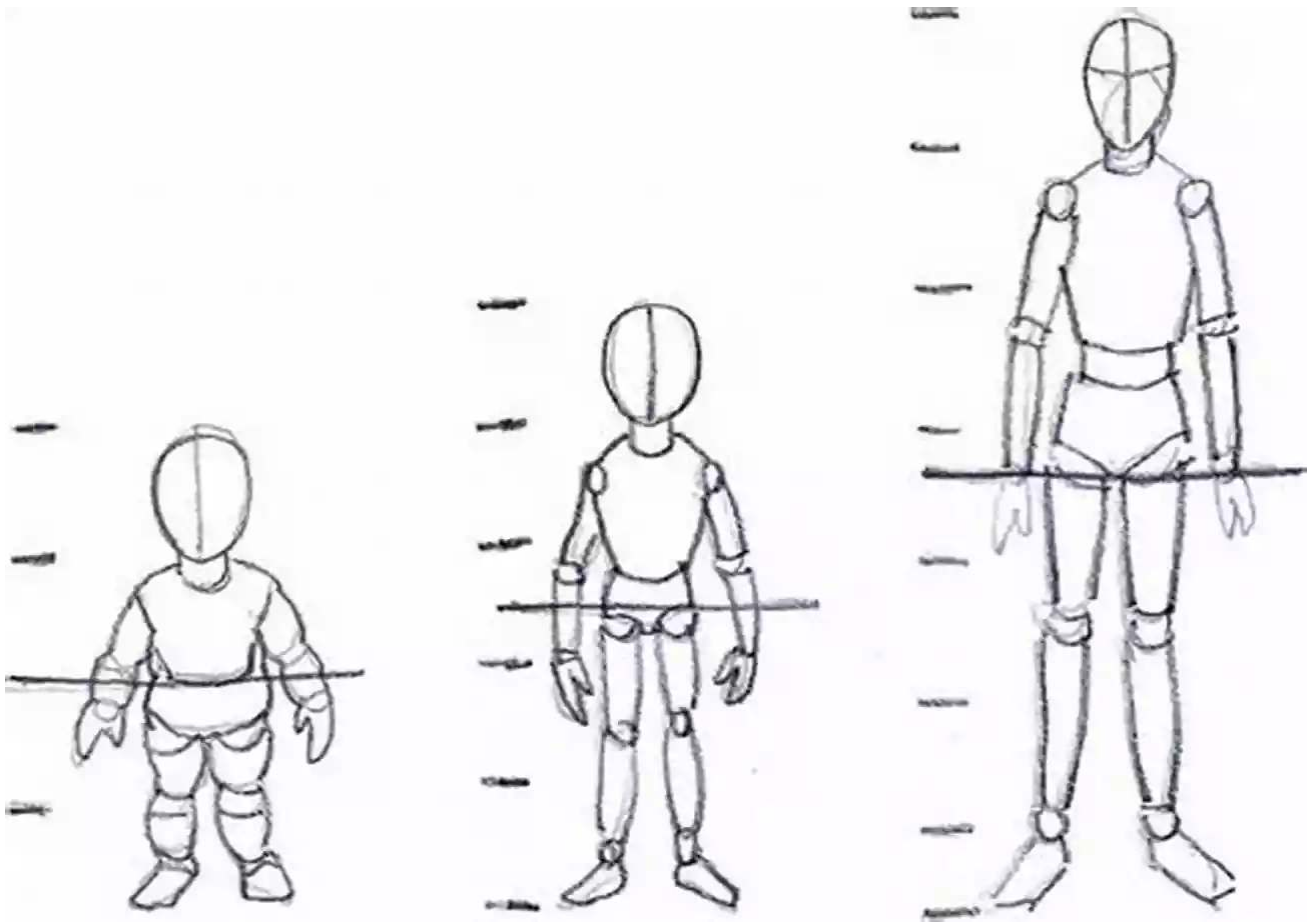


Drawing facial features for children and babies
