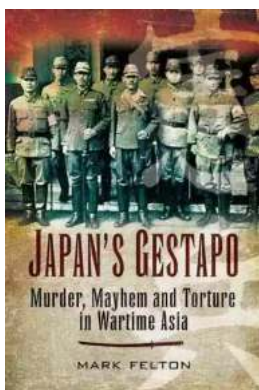


Murder Mayhem And Torture In Wartime Asia

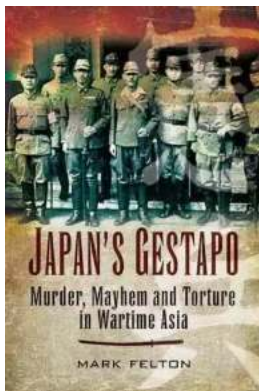

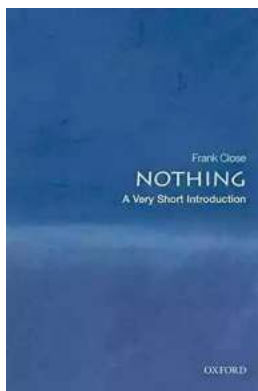

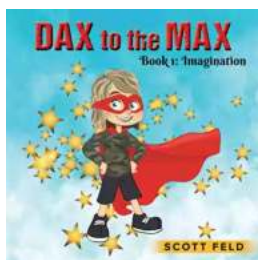
