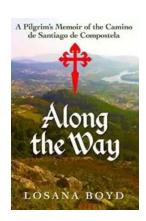

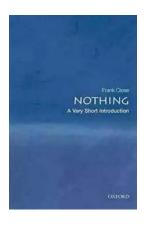
lose you in distractions; it's not about a trendy walk. It unravels the eternal gifts of El Camino to a soul living in the 21st century.
