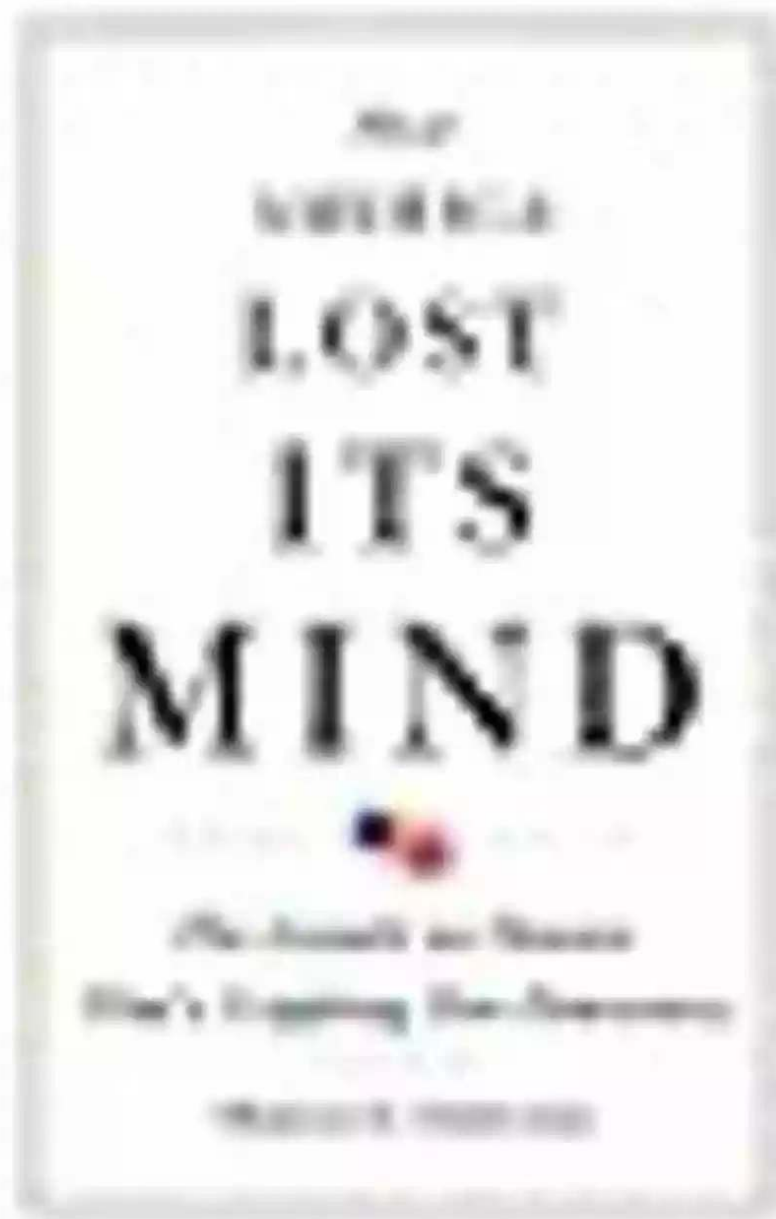


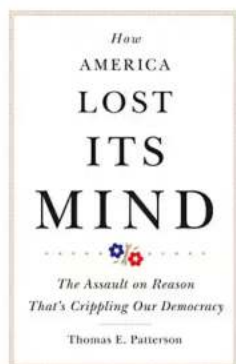

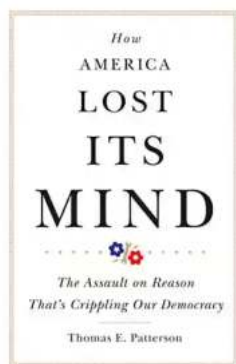

division, civility and incivility.



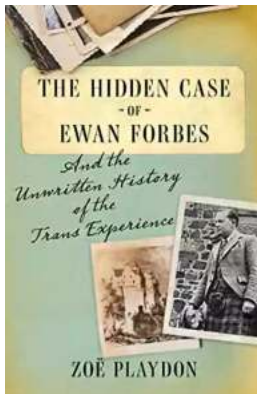
