point in the history of the Roman Empire. Still, historians try to filter the Octavian bias.



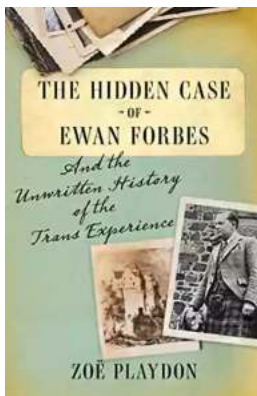

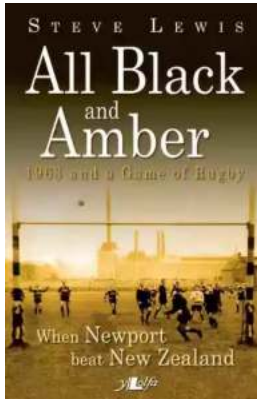

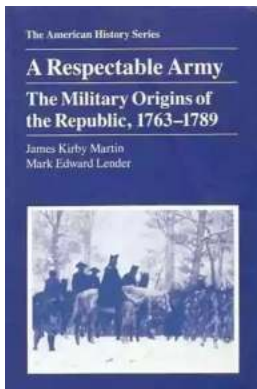
