

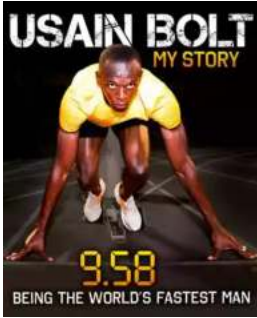

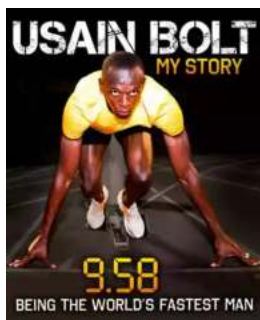

and that lightning bolt pose. It's about radiating sport's biggest smile. This is the story of the fastest man on the planet.



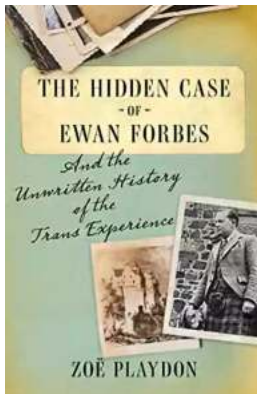
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
