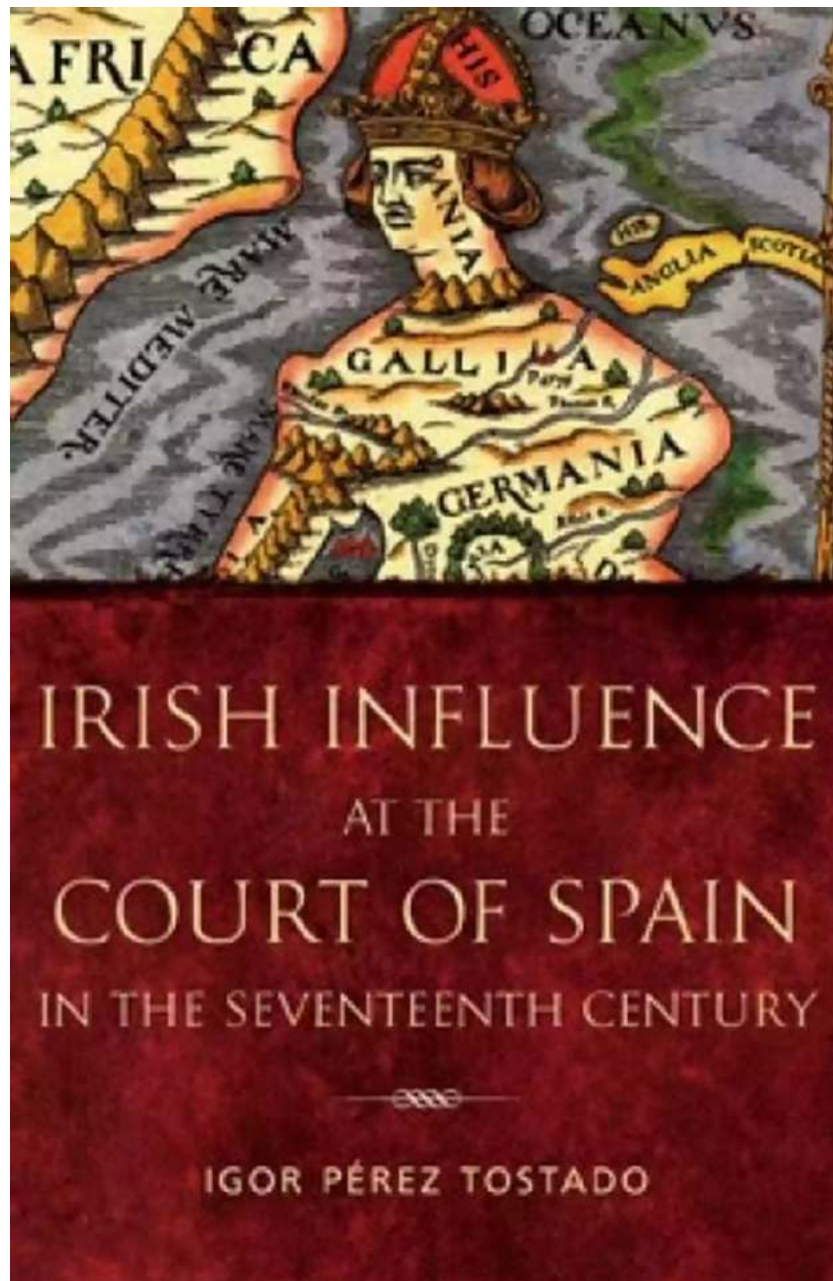

point where life and literature intersect. A strange personal gallery curated by a razor-sharp reader and his other, unknown self.



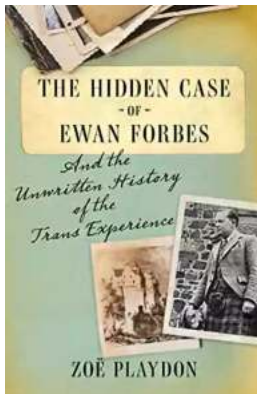
