

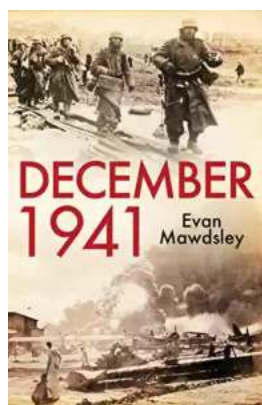
The Twelve Days That Began World War: December 1941

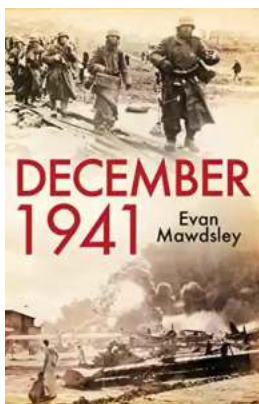

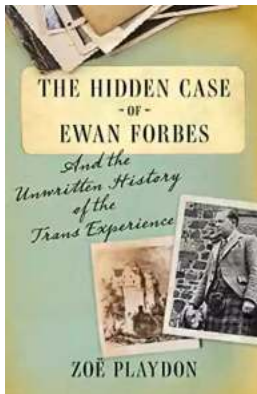
