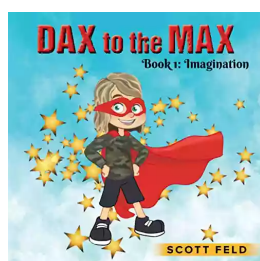
Patterns for 12 different cacti!
