

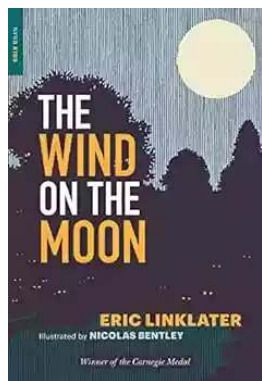

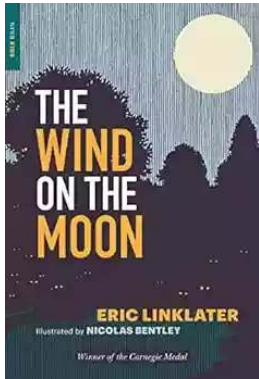

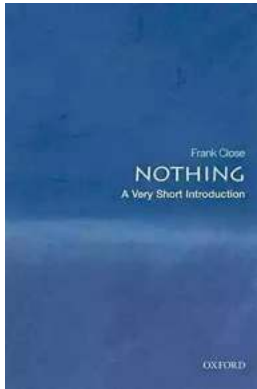


### WINNER OF THE CARNEGIE MEDAL

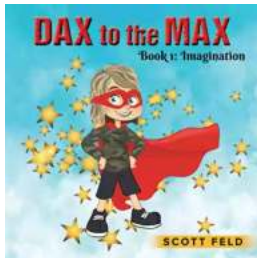

hilarity and great adventure is also a work of high seriousness; after all, “life without freedom,” as the valiant puma makes clear, “is a poor, poor thing.”



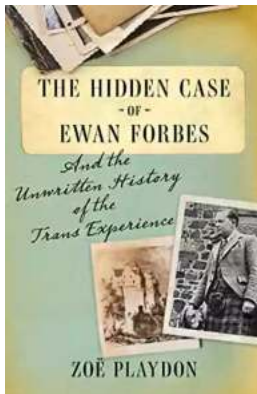
