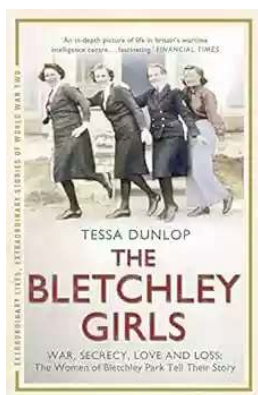

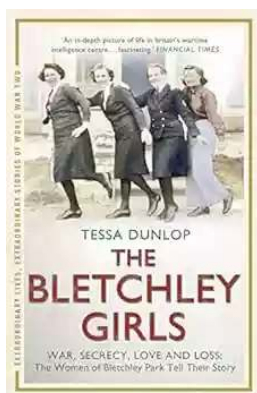

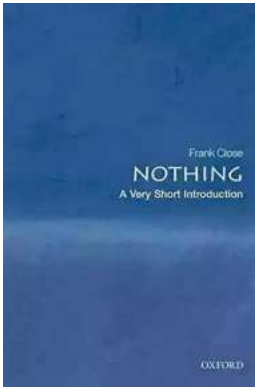

girls at the Park but soon they outnumbered the men three to one.

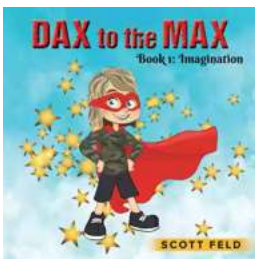
A refugee from Belgium, a Scottish debutante, a Jewish 14-year-old, and a

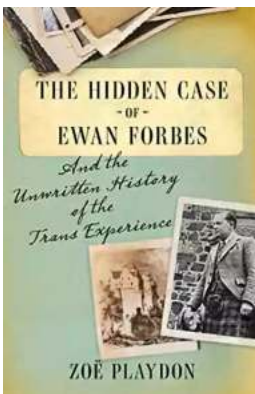
