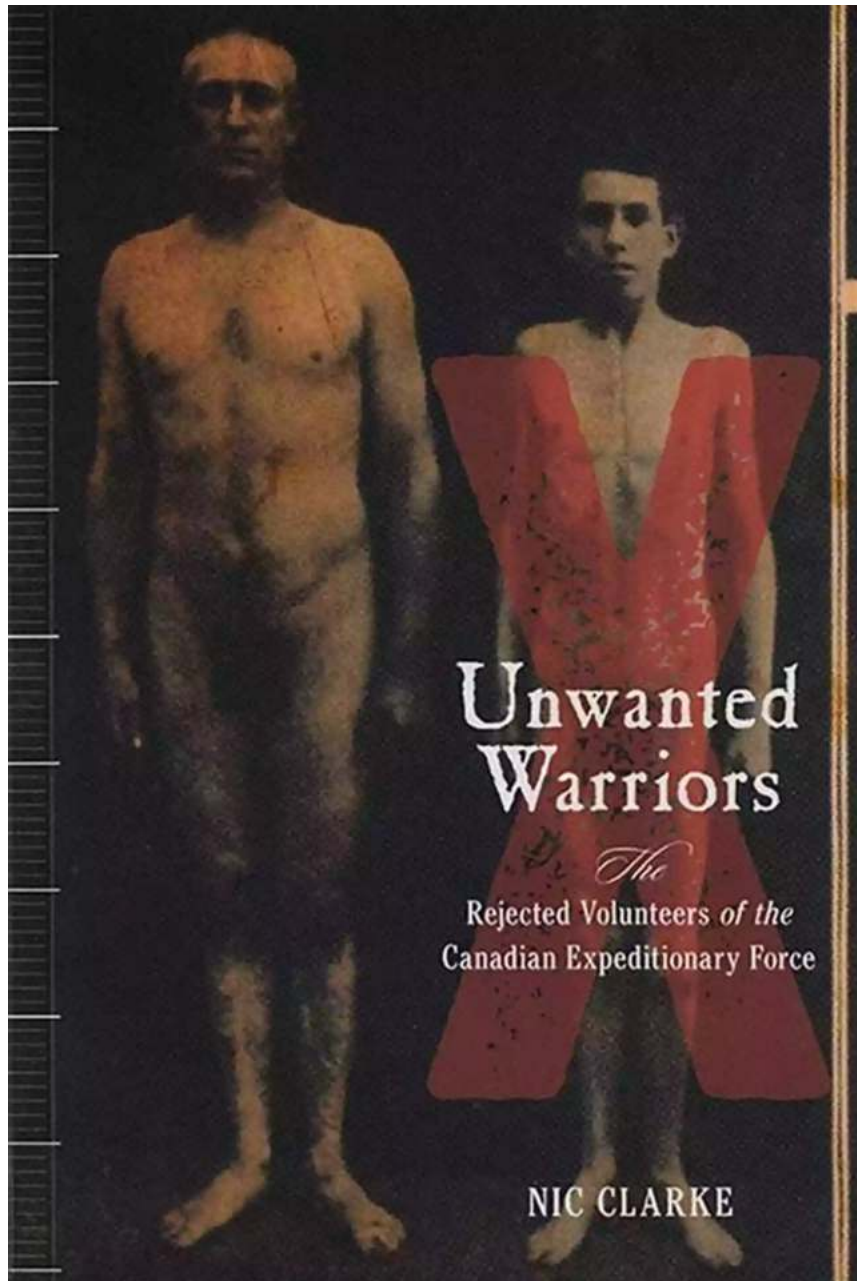


Who Were the Rejected Volunteers of the Canadian Expeditionary Force?

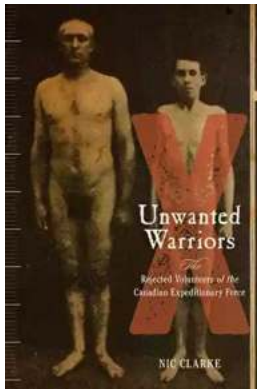
